Mount Mercy Facilities

Located at 1425 Bridge Street NW, Mount Mercy is situated on 30 rolling, park-like acres. The setting includes walkways and wooded areas, flower gardens and a stone grotto. A gazebo near the main building is an ideal outdoor meeting spot for painting, drawing, photography or writing workshops.

Indoor facilities include an auditorium with stage, as well as a cafeteria with full kitchen.

These facilities are available to local artists and performers who want to not only create art, music and theater, but also interact with Mount Mercy residents by providing classes, workshops and performances.
